

ND Palomino Pinto Beans

Product Overview

Palomino are a slow darkening pinto bean, jointly released by the North Dakota Agricultural Experiment Station and the USDA-ARS in 2016. ND Palomino pinto beans offer the slow



darkening trait and competitive agronomic performance. Exhibits upright indeterminate (short vine) growth habit (Type IIa), produces white flowers, and matures in approximately 102 days. Agronomic performance and seed color, size, and shape are within acceptable commercial ranges of popular pinto bean cultivars grown in North Dakota. Resistant to Bean Common Mosaic Virus (BCMV), but susceptible to rust race 20-3 and anthracnose race 73. Susceptibility to bacterial diseases such as common bacterial blight and halo blight is similar to the commercial checks. Canning quality is within acceptable commercial ranges.
